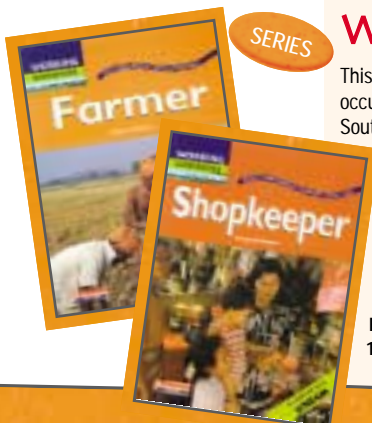


Working Worldwide

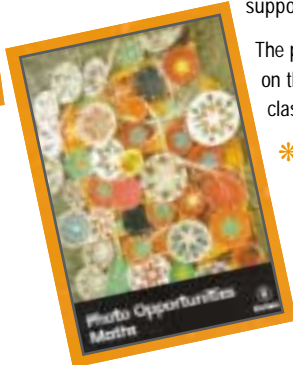

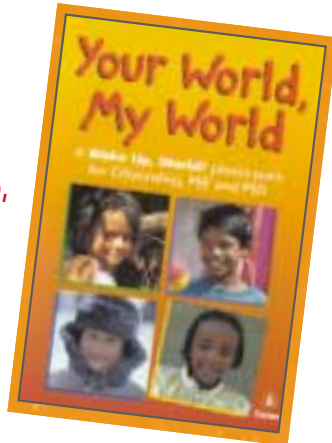
