Day 1 Morning session: World Cup football... and the world

Activity 2: World Cup quiz

Time required: 25 min

You will need

- A copy of the **World Cup quiz sheet** for each pair of pupils (below)
- A copy of the **teacher's answer sheet** (below)
- Globes or atlases for pupils to refer to

Aim

To encourage pupils to take an interest in the countries taking part in the World Cup.

What to do

Give each pair of pupils a copy of the **World Cup quiz sheet** (below). Read them the clue for each question, and give them time to complete the answers. Ask them to consult with each other, using globes or atlases if necessary. When the quiz is over, ask them to swap papers with another pair, then read the answers out to them, discussing any issues which arise. Was there anything in particular which surprised them?
