## WRITE A LETTER TO YOUR MP ABOUT THE LOBBYING BILL

## What to do before your write your letter

- Find out if how your MP voted: <a href="http://www.oxfam.org.uk/blogs/2013/11/gagging-law-mp-results-table">http://www.oxfam.org.uk/blogs/2013/11/gagging-law-mp-results-table</a>
- If your MP voted against the bill, thank them for doing so.
- If your MP voted for the bill, tell them that you are concerned and ask them why they have done so.

## Ideas of what to include in your letter

- You are concerned about part 2 of the Transparency of Lobbying, Non-Party Campaigning and Trade Union Administration Bill.
- There has been a lack of debate around this bill and you are concerned about the speed at which it is being pushed through Parliament.
- In its current form, this bill **threatens to stifle legitimate public debate** and non-party political campaigning on policies that affect people's lives.
- There is still a great deal of ambiguity in the Governments' amendments to the bill.
  Legal opinion suggests that amendments will not result in allowing charities to campaign on important issues in election years.
- Give examples of campaigns you have joined or admired it may be a local campaign to save your hospital or an international campaign on Fairtrade.
- If that campaign had taken place during an election year, would you have been able to get involved? The legislation is unclear what activities would fall foul of it.

## Ask your MP to:

- Write to the ministers leading this Bill (Mr Andrew Lansley MP and Mr Tom Brake MP)
- Listen to the proposals made by the Commission on Civil Society and Democratic Engagement and vote for them when they get a chance.
