

# Oxfam Lucky Numbers

**The lucky numbers game is a quick and simple way to raise additional funds for your fundraising target. Host this game in your workplace by following these easy steps:**

- Hand out the entry form to your colleagues and ask each player to submit 6 numbers from 1 to 49. These will be their numbers for the duration of the game which can last several weeks.
- Players will then be asked to make a weekly donation to your teams fundraising in order to be included in the Lucky numbers game (usually £1 a week).
- Each Saturday, the numbers from the National lottery are checked against your individual players lucky numbers, and if any players have a number which matches with one in the lottery then this is marked off. A little like Bingo.
- The first player to have all six numbers drawn, wins half the total pot. The remainder of the pot is put towards your fundraising.
- For example, if after 5 weeks one player has had all of their numbers drawn at least once in the Saturday National Lottery draw, and there are 20 people playing for £1 a week, the pot will be £100, and the winner will have won £50.
- The winning share of the pot will be shared if there is more than one winner.
- If anyone has not paid the weekly donation before the Saturday draw their numbers will be removed from the game, and any money paid into the game at that point is not refundable.
- It is advisable that when an individual has won the pot, this should be communicated to all players, and preferably displayed on a notice board or in a public area for at least a week after the event.
