

YOUTH LEADERSHIP GUIDE

This guide supports senior school students and experienced youth campaigners to plan and lead Send My Friend To School campaigns.

An important audience for Send My Friend to School is younger school students. This is a knowledgeable and enthusiastic group to campaign with. Before you begin, make sure you agree your plans with your teacher and they have registered your school at www.sendmyfriend.org



1. TEACH YOUNGER STUDENTS

Teach the Send My Friend to School campaign to the other students in your school. This could be an **assembly** and/or **lessons**. You will need a teacher's help to organise your schedule, but the more of the planning you're responsible for the better. Practice your presentation or lesson with your friends first before doing it for real and remember to make a call to action. The 2022 PowerPoint will help you. Use it as it is or edit it to suit your purpose.

2. SPREAD THE SEND MY FRIEND TO SCHOOL CAMPAIGN TO YOUR OLD PRIMARY SCHOOL

Contact your old primary school and ask if you can present an assembly or lesson for Send My Friend to School. Your teacher will almost certainly have the contact details of local primary schools. This will give you the opportunity to develop your organizational and presentation skills. And remind your primary school teacher to sign up to the campaign at www.sendmyfriend.org



3. GET CREATIVE

Get creative and promote Send My Friend to School at your school. Think about how to use your art and craft skills to design posters and displays. Can the drama department help you to stage a stunt? Do you have the social media skills to hold a school Twitter or Instagram takeover, or design a page on the school website? Remember to agree your plans with your teacher before you begin

4. MEET YOUR MP

The main purpose of Send My Friend to School is to influence MPs and the government to support education for the world's most marginalised children. 5. WRITE A PRESS RELEASE
